Every week, an average of 80 people come to the Mennonite Church in Ludwigshafen to take part in FH activities.

And we, the 18 volunteers, are happy to get to know you and learn together with you.

Participants join to sew quilts, children need support with their homework, and others require help understanding and responding to official letters and forms.

But most come here to learn and practice German.

Bi-Monthly Session 1/2025 Completed

On Wednesday, February 26, we concluded it with a celebration where participants from different groups gave small presentations.

Introducing Our Longest-Serving Volunteer: Heidi

Q: You have been involved since the founding of Friedenshaus in 2016—nine years! You are a wife, mother, grandmother, sister, friend, and neighbor —that's a lot of roles!

On top of that, you are active in your church. Why do you also volunteer at Friedenshaus?

A: Besides my family, I worked full-time for 47 years.

What do you do after retirement with "40 extra hours per week"? You look for an activity that brings joy, is good for the soul, and has meaning.

So, in addition to my church involvement, I wanted something fulfilling. Friedenshaus, founded by and with the Mennonite Church, offered language classes for refugees.

The invitation to "just drop by and see if you like it" was the foundation for my commitment to Friedenshaus.

Not only for the participants but also because my family arrived in Ludwigshafen as refugees in 1955. Back then, shortly after World War II and the refugee crisis of the time, there was very, very little support.

I have never forgotten that difficult time and want to make things a little easier for others.

Q: You help participants with forms. Were there any that stood out to you?

A: Forms were a significant part of my daily tasks during my career. So, hardly anything was unfamiliar to me, and it was a seamless transition from my job.

However, bureaucracy has exploded over the years. Official language is not always understandable, and the structure of the questions is not always logical. How is a refugee supposed to navigate that?

Q: What have you learned from the participants at Friedenshaus?

A: "Language is the key to people's hearts."

And the more we understood each other, the more wonderful connections developed. Together, we can make a difference for the better.

And with our coordinators, we have found people who serve as role models for all of us in making the world a little more humane.

Q: As the longest-serving volunteer, how would you invite others to join the FH team?

A: Just like I was invited back then! "Come by and see if you like it." At Friedenshaus, you'll find a world full of diversity. And over time, maybe even friends and people with big hearts.

Between February 28 and March 30, 2025, about 22% of the world's population will fast from dawn until sunset. This is how Muslims observe the Islamic lunar month of Ramadan.
